# Capital Hill Reservoir Replacement Project




Medford's drinking water depends on the Capital Hill Reservoirs as the hub of our distribution system, but they have had nearly 100 years of use.



We are replacing the three aging reservoirs with larger, modern tanks. This is key to providing a seismically resilient backbone to our water system that will help us recover quickly from natural disasters and continue to serve our growing region long into the future.

#### Why here?

The Capital Hill Reservoir Facility is at one of the highest points in the city, which helps it to distribute water efficiently by gravity. This location also has an extensive network of pipes that all connect here, making it key to Medford's water supply chain. We're planning to replace the reservoirs in phases so water from Capital Hill will never stop flowing.



## Project Updates Winter 2023

The first phase of design for the new reservoir is nearing completion. The pre-design report will be ready by the end of the year and will tell us what we need to take into account for creating the full reservoir design: general size, shape, and location.
