OBJECTIVE: Board Approval

Issue

Medford Water reconsiders its Cost of Service on an annual basis in order to equitably allocate revenue requirements to the various customer classes of service.

Discussion

Shawn Koorn presented study sessions to the Board on November 5 and November 19 on the 2025 Cost of Service Study.

There are no proposed changes to the rate structure or customer classes of service for all schedules, class usage characteristics and cost information was updated and specific rate components will be assessed based on actual costs: high level surcharges (system average adjustment), backflow fee (no change), and the Bulk Water Rate (updated based on current costs of providing services).

Based on HDR's analysis, staff recommends board consideration of modifications in the monthly and gallonage charges for all customer groups. A non-inclusive rate summary sheet is attached, along with a copy of the resolution; the complete rate schedules are included within Exhibit A and incorporated by reference. Notice of the public hearing was provided to all customer groups, other interested parties, as well as the general public. If approved, modified rates would become effective March 1, 2026.

Financial Impact

Total system revenue adjustment is estimated at 15.00%, 13.6% for retail customers (including inside and outside customers), 31.5% for districts, and 26.8% for Partner Cities.

Requested Board Action

Staff recommends approval of Resolution 2010, which modifies water rates for all customer groups served by the Medford Water system.

RESOLUTION NO. 2010

A RESOLUTION Prescribing and Establishing Rates for the Use and Sale of Water from the Municipal Water System of the City of Medford, Oregon, Within and Without Said City, to Intermittent Users, and to Special Outside Customers, Repealing All Prior Rates in Conflict Herewith and Providing That the Modifications as Set Forth in the 2025 Cost of Service Study Shall Become Effective on March 1, 2026, and Thereafter

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF WATER COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF MEDFORD, OREGON, AS FOLLOWS, THAT:

SECTION 1. On the 28th day of February 2026, all rates heretofore prescribed and established for the use and sale of water from the municipal water system of the City of Medford, Oregon, within and without said City, shall be repealed.

SECTION 2. Beginning with the billing for water service on March 1, 2026, and thereafter, the rates for the use and sale of water from the municipal water system of the City of Medford, Oregon—both within and outside the city limits—shall be as set forth in the Schedules of the 2025 Cost of Service Study. A copy of said study is on file at the Medford Water office and is hereby incorporated by reference. A non-exhaustive summary of the rates (per 1,000 gallons) is provided below. For a complete listing of the applicable rates and charges, refer to the rate schedules attached hereto as Exhibit A, which are incorporated herein by reference. These modified schedules shall replace the repealed schedules contained in Exhibit E of the Regulations Governing Water Service, also effective March 1, 2026.

Call Hydraulic Modeling Services

OBJECTIVE: Board Approval

Issue

Staff requests an exemption from competitive solicitation per section 2.33 of Medford Water's Contracting & Purchasing Regulations and authorization to contract directly with Jacobs Engineering Group for on-call hydraulic modeling services.

Discussion

Medford Water has been contracting with CH2MHill (now Jacobs Engineering) for hydraulic modeling for over 20 years and continues to rely on their modeling team to support decision making for the water system. Jacobs Engineering has exceptional experience with water systems nationally and an intimate working knowledge of the Medford Water system and hydraulic model. This highly specialized expertise is utilized on an as-needed basis to efficiently analyze system adequacy and needs to support land development applications, capital improvement projects, and system operations.

The current three-year contract with Jacobs Engineering for this hydraulic modeling work, with a not to exceed value of \$100,000 was executed under the General Manager's purchasing authority and expires on December 31, 2025.

The proposed amendment is to extend this contract an additional three years (one year with two optional one-year extensions) with an additional not-to-exceed value of \$120,000 added to the contract. While this contract amount appears to be within the General Manager's purchasing authority, it could be argued that the cumulative value of renewal of the contract (or a new contract) then exceeds the General Manager's authority. For full transparency we are requesting from the Board through this Resolution both approval of an exemption from competitive bidding and awarding the additional contract value.

Medford Water's Contracting and Purchasing Regulations, Section 2.33(D) Contract-Specific Special Procurements (CSSP), allows for exemptions from competitive bidding in this circumstance with the Findings included in the attached resolution.

Staff finds that continued direct award of this contract to Jacobs is in the best interest of both Medford Water and the public.

Financial Impact

These services are of a highly technically unique and detailed nature, for which it is cost effective to have an outside consultant with this expertise perform this work.

Costs for the use of the on-call hydraulic modeling services contemplated in this contract are budgeted each year within the operational budget and would otherwise potentially require additional staffing.

Requested Board Action

Staff recommends approval of this Resolution, granting an exemption from competitive bidding and awarding a contract amendment to Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc. for On-Call Hydraulic Modeling Services.

A RESOLUTION Adopting Findings, Authorizing an Exemption from Competitive Bidding, and Awarding and Authorizing the General Manager to Execute a Contract Amendment in the Amount of \$120,000 with Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc., for On-Call Hydraulic Modeling Services

WHEREAS, Medford Water has previously contracted with Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc. (Jacobs Engineering) to provide ongoing on-call hydraulic modeling services; and

WHEREAS, the existing three-year contract with Jacobs Engineering, with a not to exceed value of \$100,000, expires on December 31, 2025; and

WHEREAS, Jacobs Engineering is uniquely qualified to render the services necessary as needed by Medford Water; and

WHEREAS, an exemption to competitive bidding is warranted based on the Findings attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference, which are supported by documents on file with Medford Water; and

WHEREAS, costs for use of these on-call hydraulic modeling services are budgeted within the operational budget each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the cumulative contract value including this contract amendment exceeds the General Manager's purchasing authority;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF WATER COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF MEDFORD, OREGON, AS FOLLOWS:

- SECTION 1. That the Findings hereto as Exhibit A are hereby adopted and an exemption from competitive bidding is authorized.
- SECTION 2. That an exemption from competitive bidding is granted under the provisions of Medford Water's Contracting and Purchasing Regulations, Section 2.33(D) Contract-Specific Special Procurements (CSSP), as discussed in the agenda item memorandum for the Board of Water Commissioners meeting of December 3, 2025.
- SECTION 3. That a contract amendment to the existing on-call hydraulic modeling services contract with Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc., is hereby awarded a one-year contract time extension beginning January 1, 2026, with two optional one-year renewal periods, with a total additional not-to-exceed contract value of \$120,000 added to the existing contract.
- SECTION 4. That the General Manager is hereby authorized and directed to execute said contract, payments for said amended contract on behalf of the Board of Water Commissioners. This authorization exceeds the authority of the General Manager as defined in Section 1.02 of the Commission's Contracting & Purchasing Regulations.

EXHIBIT A - RESOLUTION NO. 2011

FINDINGS

Pursuant to Medford Water Commission's Contracting and Purchasing Regulations, Section 2.33(D)(1) Contract-Specific Special Procurements (CSSP), the following facts support an exemption from competitive solicitation for plumbing services:

Awarding the Contract-Specific Special Procurement (CSSP)...

(a) is unlikely to encourage favoritism in the awarding of public contracts or to substantially diminish competition for public contracts

Jacobs Engineering has exceptional experience with water systems nationally and an intimate working knowledge of the Medford Water system and hydraulic model, having provided support services to Medford Water in this capacity for over a decade.

Jacobs Engineering is also part of the consultant team currently contracted with Medford Water to update the water system master plan over this and the following fiscal year. Synergy between that project and work performed under this requested contract amendment can only be achieved by continuing with Jacobs Engineering for this contract.

(b) <u>and</u> is reasonably expected to result in substantial cost savings to the contracting agency or to the public

Jacobs Engineering staff are very familiar with our water system, leading to fast, efficient, and accurate evaluations. Using another engineering firm for these services would require extensive time and expense from both the consultant and Medford Water staff to match the level of understanding and familiarity that Jacobs Engineering already has.

(c) <u>or</u> otherwise substantially promotes the public interest in a manner that could not practicably be realized by complying with requirements that are applicable under state procurement law or these regulations.

Pursuant to 2.33(d)(2), public notice of the exemption from competitive solicitation was published on Medford Water's website on November 24, 2025.
